## WHO

## WHERE

The small town of Abetenim near Kumasi in the Ashanti Region, Ghana

## WHY

In Abetenim village, the children do not have local access to secondary school education and must walk prohibitive distances to access the few schools that do exist. By building a local secondary school, the children can continue their education in their hometown.

## COST

Airfare, visa and vaccinations are on your behalf. Cost for food and accommodation are 100€/week. We also ask for a one-time project contribution of 300€ from each participant in order to finance the building materials and organise the workshop.
